BOARD OF VETERANS AFFAIRS DECISION

DENIAL OF INCREASE OF SERVICE-CONNECTED DISABILITY AND, AWARD FOR RETROACTIVE BENEFITS FOR V.A. HOSPITALIZATIONS

OVER A THREE YEAR PERIOD.

ISSUE:

The determination of this BVA Decision is the denial of an increase for my service-connected disability. This Decision by the Veterans Board of Appeals in Washington, D.C. is in violation of 38 CFR 4.130, "EVALUATION OF PSYCHIATRIC DISABILITIES", claiming my disability had not changed.

DISCUSSION:

The 1985 BVA Decision, in referring to the 1982 BVA DECISION under EVIDENCE, page 3, reads, in part, "On the basis of such evidence the Board made the following pertinent finding of fact: THE VETERAN'S SCHIZOPHRENIC REACTION, LATENT TYPE, IS PRIMARILY MANIFESTED BY SYMPTOMATOLOGY IN GOOD REMISSION WITH NO MORE THAN CONSIDERABLE IMPAIRMENT OF SOCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL ADAPTABILITY".

Page 4, of the 1985 BVA Decision, continues..."BASED ON THE FINDINGS OF FACT"..."A RATING IN EXCESS OF THE 50% CURRENTLY ASSIGNED FOR SCHIZOPHRENIC REACTION, LATENT TYPE, IS NOT WARRANTED". The following list of psychiactric evaluations were used to affirm the 1982 BVA Decision.

The VA changed the diagnosis of number one to LATENT SCHIZOPHENIA, 70%, with a total rating of 100% due to unemployability. Then the BVA reduced the rating to 50% THUS automatically terminating "unemployability". This represented only a change in diagnosis, not a change in my basic condition. This also represents to me the beginning of my problems with the Veterans Adminstration.

CONCLUSIONS:

AS CAN BE SEEN BY THE ABOVE LIST OF RATINGS AND DIAGNOSIS, THE VA ERRED IN THE ABOVE BOARD OF VETERANS APPEALS DECISION, SEPT 1982, BY NOT CHANGING THE 50% LATENT SCHIZOPHRENIA RATING (on at least seven occations) as required PER 38 CFR 3.157, 3.201, 3.303, 3.326, 3.327. This decision also violates part or all of the following regulations: 38 CFR 3.101 AND 2, 3.105, 3.156, AS WELL AS 38 CFR 4.13, 4.16 (unemployability)
